



Justice in the Jewish Tradition

A Graduate Workshop at Princeton University

August 12th – August 15th, 2010

The Tikvah Project at Princeton University is inviting applications for a 4-day graduate student workshop and seminar in Princeton in August 2010. The seminar will be led by Clifford Orwin (University of Toronto), Menachem Kellner (University of Haifa) and Leora Batnitzky (Princeton University).

The event will have two parts:

- Two days (Thurs-Fri) of close study of classic Jewish texts, led by Professors Orwin, Kellner and Batnitzky. The topic for this portion of the program will be *Justice in the Jewish Tradition* and the texts will include selections from Genesis, Maimonides, Hermann Cohen, and others.
- A day and a half (Saturday Night-Sun) of workshop-type presentations of the participants' own work for other students and invited faculty to comment on and discuss. Papers will be circulated well in advance to facilitate careful review. The topics of the papers will, we expect, reflect the diversity of intellectual projects of the participants. This will be an opportunity to receive feedback from thinkers who bring the perspective of a variety of academic disciplines.

Accommodations and kosher meals will be provided for participants. No official seminar events will be conducted on Shabbat (Aug 13th).
